

### **MOPC College Scholarship Funds**

If you will be attending a college in the fall, now is the time to send in your application for Scholarship Funds to assist with your tuition for the next year. All applications are available in the church office and are due by April 15 to the Administration, Finance & Planning Committee. The application shall include a letter from the applicant explaining a substantial financial need and hardship. Students who are now receiving scholarships must reapply each year.

There are three college scholarship funds available to assist financially those students who qualify for them. Please check the scholarship you are applying for on the application.

The first one is the **Virginia Baker Scholarship Fund**. It's purpose is to assist with tuition or other expenses for any member of MOPC attending or having been accepted as an undergraduate student at a Presbyterian affiliated college or university.

The second one is the **Tinker Best Scholarship Fund**. It's purpose is to assist with tuition or other expenses for any member of MOPC for whom attending any college or university as an undergraduate or graduate student will be a financial hardship.

The third one is the **Jimmy and Lorraine I. Kornegay Endowment Fund.** It's purpose is to help college students who are members of this church purchase college textbooks.
